5. Brief Description of Module (purpose, principal aims and objectives)

This module provides a foundation in research methodology and design in the field of counselling & psychotherapy. It supports the preparation, planning and initial review phases of students' research dissertations for the major literature review or case study projects. Students evaluate research methodology and its relationship to different perspectives in counselling & psychotherapy. Students will develop an understanding of processes, ethics, rationale and strategies involved in undertaking research in counselling & psychotherapy. Students are required to engage in peer supervision groups and peer feedback tasks to support their learning on this module. Students must identify a topic for research which may be drawn from a variety of sources including: research groups, personal experience, therapeutic practice, a lecturer-suggested topic or a professional subject of their specific interest (provided suitable academic supervision is available). They must then formulate a rationale for their study, and develop a research question. Students must identify 8 single study primary research papers to support their rationale and submit a 2500 word research proposal together with their UCC ethics application. Students will present their work in progress to peers and tutor for formative feedback.
