Module Description:

This module is aimed at consolidating and applying the skills and knowledge gained throughout your contextual studies.

It requires you to operate in a largely independent manner, undertaking a detailed and independent investigation of the theoretical and contextual underpinning of a specific subject, topic or question.

The outcome of this analytic and academic exploration will be a written and illustrated dissertation that demonstrates your ability to present cogently and coherently argued research and analysis.

Although you are expected to independently undertake the research and written work for this module, your efforts will be supported through a series of lectures, seminars and tutorials.

These sessions will ensure you are fully briefed on the requirements of producing a piece of academic writing, and will also support you in applying the critical and interpretive skills needed to adequately explore your chosen subject.
