After pursing a freelance career in Music, Nils joined the University of Reading as course director of the BA (Ed) music specialism and MA Instrumental Teaching courses in 2007. In 2013 he was appointed Head of Studies at the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art (LAMDA), and took up his current post as Dean of Higher Education at University Centre Colchester in 2017.
	In 2018, Nils became a member of the Quality Assessment Committee of the Office for Students, the UK's regulator for Higher Education.
Biography and personal interests:	Nils' background in musical performance and performance pedagogy has informed much of his published and institutional work. Balancing the requirements of posts in Higher Education with practical music activities has led to project-based performances internationally, from a three-programme series at St. John's, Smith Square (London) to performances with orchestras, including the St.Petersburg Philharmonic, and appearing live on BBC Radio 3. Much of this has been disseminated in the media internationally, with reviews of his work appearing in Gramophone, BBC Music Magazine, The Strad, International Piano, Music Teacher, and Pianist Magazine.
	Nils' experience of Higher Education includes universities, conservatoires and mixed economy institutions, giving him a clear understanding of academic and vocational training opportunities in the UK. He has a particular expertise in programme innovation, academic course design, and the student experience.
	Nils has a keen interest in 19 th century furniture styles, British domestic architecture, contemporary politics, ancient history and musical memorabilia, of which he has too many.

Professional practice / research interests:

Nils has extensive experience in presenting in public, both in commercial and academic environments. These include, but are not exclusive to, Music Teachers' National Association (MTNA) in the United States (2009 & 2018), Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (ABRSM) International Conferences (Malaysia, 2002), The King's Place, London (2011), European Piano Teachers' Association (EPTA) conferences (UK: 2011 & 2014, Austria: 2012, 2015 & 2017 and Germany: 2015), Frankfurt Musikmesse (2013 & 2014), the University of Malta (2010), and the University of Warwick (2015).

He has also given invited academic conference presentations at international conferences at the Universities of London, Durham and Edinburgh (2010-2012). The subject of these has been performance practice in the piano music of Rachmaninov.

Other knowledge transfer activities have included being an External Examiner for the B Ed music course at the University of Plymouth (2010-2014), and being an external subject-specific assessor for an MA piano pedagogy dissertation (University of Perth, Australia, 2011).

In addition, he has reviewed music publications (MMA magazine Ensemble, 1999-2003), and written music journalism articles (European EPTA magazine Piano Journal, 2011 & 2015). In 2016, he was the guest editor of EPTA UK's magazine *Piano Professional*, published tri-annually. Since 2017, he has been a regular contributor to the UK's *Pianist Magazine*.

Most of Nils' academic research focuses on the pedagogical practices of pianist-composers between the 1780s and 1920s.
