What will I study?



Over the two years you will study a broad range of skills, technique, practitioners and approaches which could include: Improvisation, Devising, Naturalistic Acting, Screen Acting, Classical and Contemporary Texts, Audition Technique, Voice and Speech, Audio Performance, Shakespeare, Artaud, Brecht, Absurdism, Modern Playwrights, Self-Promotion as a Performer.

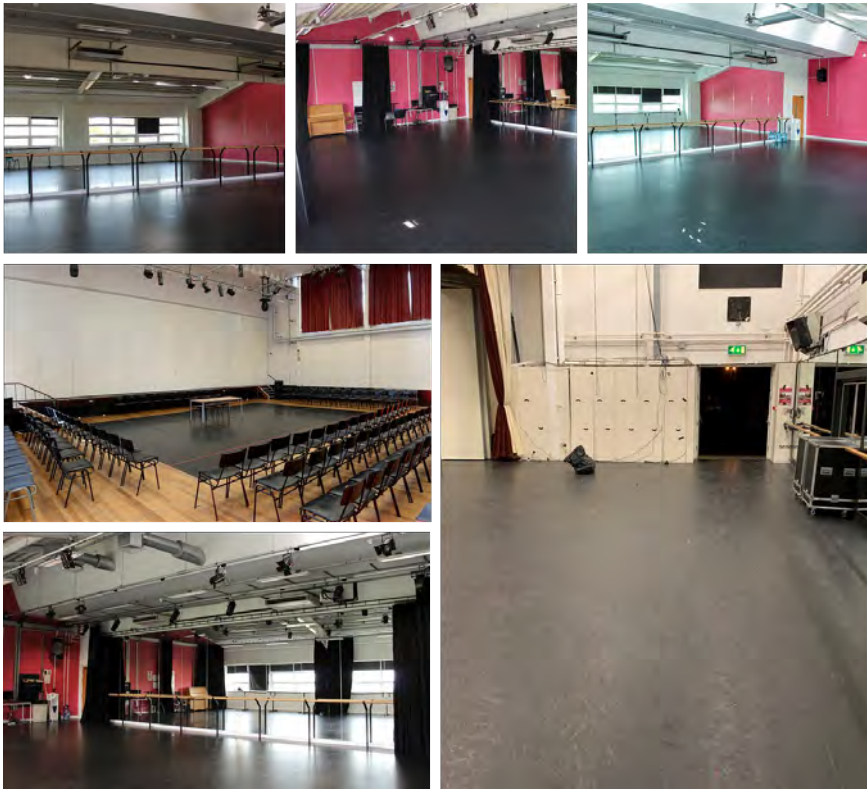

Practice
