


Where will you be learning?

Guided written assignments


Practical Assessment




What do students do after the course?

Dress Code

- •Hair: Should be clean and styled when in Hairdressing. In the Beauty Salons hair should be in a neat secure bun or plaits
- •No Jewellery: except stone free wedding band
- •Piercings: Only one small pair of stud earrings can be worn, flesh/clear coloured retainers must be worn in all other visible piercings.
- •Nails: Short and clean. NO nail polish, False nails or overlays.
- •Uniform: ONLY a clean, pressed college uniform can be worn when in a salon. No leggings, jeggings, jeans or shorts are permitted.
- •Shoes: flat, clean, closed toe shoes in salon (no flip flops, boots or heels)
- •ID card: Students are required to produce and wear the ID card at all times
