Expectations of Students.










Motor Vehicle Groups

Sponge filter £2.85


Connection pipe £3.95

English & Maths are essential skills to all elements of our courses. They provide the tools required to compliment all areas of Motor Vehicle maintenance.



You will be required to attend Maths and English classes until you obtain a grade 4 In both subjects.

English & Maths Qualification on Entry	Enrolment Learning Aims
GCSE Grade 9-4 (Grade A*-C)	Not required to attend GCSE classes.
GCSE Grade 3 or Functional Skills L2 (Grade D)	GCSE Resit to achieve a Grade 9-4
GCSE Grade 2-1 (Grade F-G)	GCSE Resit to achieve a Grade 9-4



Appeals procedure

In the event that you should wish to make an appeal regarding the result of a practical assessment or an on line examination, please note the following appeals procedure.

A verbal appeal must first be made to your Assessor if you are not satisfied with this outcome a formal appeal in writing should be made to the Internal Verifier,

If you are still not satisfied a formal appeal in writing should be made to the **Centre Co-ordinator**.

Student Course Representative

Anyone interested in becoming a course representative will be nominated by their course group. Further information can be found out about this by your course tutor or PDT

Concerns of a general nature which are shared by several students should be raised by the elected student representative, Course Leader or with the Course Committees as appropriate. If an issue remains unresolved then students can make a formal complaint in accordance with the Institutes Student Grievance Procedure.





Examinations and Assessments

On-going performance will be assessed by practical workshop tasks, phase tests and on-line exams.

In order to gain your qualification you will be required to satisfactorily complete practical assessments and on-line multiple choice examinations both of which are set by the awarding body.

These may vary in number depending on the units you are studying towards. Dates and times of examinations will be given to you.





Individual Tutorials

In the individual tutorial sessions you will have a one to one interview with a tutor, this will be to discuss your progress on the course and any issues the teaching team may have regarding your progress.

It is also an opportunity for you to discuss any issues you may have regarding your course or any issues outside of college which may affect your ability to complete your course
