How We Use Your Personal Information

Education and Skills Funding Agency Privacy Statement 2022/23

This privacy notice is issued by the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) on behalf of the Secretary of State for the Department of Education (DfE) to inform learners about the Individualised Learner Record (ILR) and how their personal information is used in the ILR. Your personal information is used by the DfE to exercise our functions under article 6(1)(e) of the UK GDPR and to meet our statutory responsibilities, including under the Apprenticeships, Skills, Children and Learning Act 2009.

The ILR collects data about learners and learning undertaken. Publicly funded colleges, training organisations, local authorities, and employers (FE providers) must collect and return the data to the ESFA each year under the terms of a funding agreement, contract or grant agreement. It helps ensure that public money distributed through the ESFA is being spent in line with government targets. It is also used for education, training, employment, and well being purposes, including research. We retain ILR learner data for 3 years for operational purposes and 66 years for research purposes. ILR data is shared with third parties where it complies with DfE data sharing procedures and where the law allows it. The DfE and the English European Social Fund (ESF) Managing Authority (or agents acting on their behalf) may contact learners to carry out research and evaluation to inform the effectiveness of training. Colchester Institute and University Centre Privacy Statement 2022/23

All graduates receiving a recognised higher education qualification from a further education college (FEC) will need to be surveyed for the Graduate Outcomes survey. The Office for Students will use your contact details for the purpose of undertaking the Graduate Outcomes survey approximately 15 months after graduation. The survey will be undertaken by an appointed 3rd party specialist organisation contracted for this purpose.

We provide information to examination boards, our funding bodies and their partners, and Local Authorities, where appropriate. We are obliged to help police and other government organisations (e.g. Department for Work and Pensions) with their enquiries. We will disclose information about your education, health, safety and well-being upon receipt of a formal written request by a relevant authority (e.g. Social Care, Police) where there are justifiable reasons to make such a disclosure, we may also provide personal data such as address, phone number or confirmation of your whereabouts at a particular time.

Other organisations include Essex County Council and Local Authorities, Schools, Higher Education Statistics agency, Office for Students (OfS), Student Loan Company and educational institutions.

You may be contacted after you have completed your programme of learning to establish whether you have entered employment or gone onto further training or education.

Colchester Institute will retain your personal data in accordance with the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018 for as long as is considered necessary for the legitimate business purpose under which it was collected.
