5. Brief Description of Module (purpose, principal aims and objectives)

The module is designed to provide you with an understanding and awareness of the requirements to prepare and perform a showcase style performance. The module encourages you to reflect on your abilities in the disciplines of acting, dance and singing and demands you to choose and develop appropriate material for your own ability as well as the showcase context.

The opportunity to tour the showcase performance requires stamina and consistently energised performances. It also offers you an experience of working in a number of venues with varying technical facilities and support. There will be a requirement to understand and respond to varying audience demographics, and the module will also offer an insight into theatre in education.

You may be required to take the lead for one or more various activities: e.g. singing warm ups and exercises, dance warm ups, choreography leads, acting-through-song masterclasses, Q&A about the industry and training and other roles that may occur. This will be a valuable confidence builder and reaffirms the success and progression that you have made in your for three years of training, preparing you for potential teaching and other leadership roles. Any role must be negotiated with the module leader.

Although they do not have summative assessments and so do not directly contribute to your marks, you will receive regular formative advice and guidance during class sessions and at key points within each semester. The skills you develop in these classes will be applicable to the summative assessments in your practical modules.
