There remains a focus on the vocal demands, context, narrative and choreography required in performance. Students are introduced to a higher intensity of rehearsal and are guided by staff to reflect on their current progress and choice of material. The module explores the emotional, physical and vocal responses to text, movement and music encouraging you to make and maintain appropriate technical choices in rehearsals and a public performance context.
