

Study Options

Full-Time or Apprenticeship Studies

People can attend courses at Colchester Institute in one of two ways:

Full Time: 2-3 days per week on a Study Programme if you are 16-19 years old (Currently under Covid conditions only 1 day on-campus and 2 days digital learning)

Part Time: 1 day per week on an Apprenticeship Standard

Both routes require a student to study English and maths if they have not gained a Grade 4 or above, in these subjects previously
