BENEFITS OF VOCATIONAL STUDY

There are many different study options available after taking GCSEs. If you have an idea of the job or career you'd like to pursue, or you wish to continue your education developing a particular talent, skill or passion, then one of our technical and professional programmes could be the right choice for you. There's a fantastic range of options available and vocational learning can help you get the skills, experience and qualifications you need to kick-start your career or go on to higher education. Many of these skills are transferable which makes vocational courses a great choice.

Our Study Programmes are designed to help you learn about specific employment areas, they are hands-on and provide the opportunity to practise skills in real situations while working towards recognised qualifications. Throughout the programme you'll be assessed on ability, knowledge and theory relating directly to your chosen industry, rather than doing only lengthy essays and exams.

As vocational qualifications are designed in partnership with employers, universities and professional organisations, your training will enable you to develop the skills that are highly valued by employers. You'll have the opportunity to broaden your understanding of your chosen area through work experience and placements throughout your programme.

The in-depth skills and knowledge acquired on a Level 3 vocational programme can provide the ideal preparation for progression to higher level study, such as a degree, HNC/HND or higher apprenticeship. Most colleges and universities accept vocational qualifications as fulfilling entry requirements.

The UCAS Tariff points system is used when making offers to applicants and most post-16 qualifications are allocated a total UCAS point score. The table below shows how many UCAS points the most common qualifications are worth.

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are new Level 3 qualifications that follow on from GCSEs. They are equivalent to three A Levels and combine classroom theory, practical learning and an industry placement. The placement element involves working with an employer for a minimum of *315 hours over 45 days to ensure you really get to know the subject.

The two-year T Level courses listed below have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work.

For dedicated students, T Levels provide excellent destinations for students, including full-time skilled employment, higher level apprenticeships and Higher Education degrees.

Available T Levels:

EARLY YEARS EDUCATOR

Suitable for anyone wanting a career in early years education or childcare. Students study a range of thought-provoking topics and develop knowledge about child development, safeguarding, special educational needs, as well as examining the specifics of social interaction, how language is acquired and understanding behaviour.

Placement for Early Years Educator is *750 hours over 21 weeks

DESIGN, SURVEYING AND PLANNING FOR CONSTRUCTION

Specifically suitable for careers in surveying and design, civil engineering, building services design or hazardous materials surveying. Students learn about health and safety, construction methods, digital engineering techniques, sustainability, project management, business and commerce of construction, mathematical principles and risk management.

ONSITE CONSTRUCTION (CARPENTRY AND JOINERY SPECIALISM)

Specifically for careers in carpentry and joinery. Students develop a general understanding of construction, including: health and safety, sustainability, mathematical principles and digital techniques. Skills taught include: cuts, joints and fixture methods to assemble various timberbased products.

While they vary between subject areas, T Level qualifications are assessed by passing all units and include:

- Core components
- Written examinations
- Completion of work placements
- Employer set practical projects
- An occupational specialism component

These qualifications are graded overall as Distinction*, Distinction, Merit, Pass and there will be grades for each aspect of the course.

You will be asked to enter your predicted (or actual) GCSE grades and other qualifications, so please make sure you have these nearby while you are completing the form.

On the last page of the application form, please make sure you click the 'Submit' button.

You will receive an email to confirm that your application has been submitted.

STEP 2



CREATE YOUR ACCOUNT

Once you have clicked the 'Apply Online' button, you will need to create an account which you will use throughout the application process. Please make sure you use an email address that you will be checking regularly and is professional and appropriate for this purpose. You will be asked to create a password and a password security answer, so make sure it is something memorable – please keep it somewhere safe so you don't forget it.

Do not use a school email address.

If you've applied in previous years, please do not create a new account just contact us to check which username and password to use.

Don't forget to make a note of your USERNAME and PASSWORD details! You will need these later.





BOOK YOUR INTERVIEW

Once you have submitted your application form, a member of the Admissions team will check all of your details and your predicted (or actual) grades. They might email you to ask for more information.

Once your application has been checked, you will receive an email asking you to log in to your account and book your interview. Make sure you check your emails regularly or you may miss your interview slot.

Interviews could be in person or they could be on the phone. This will be confirmed in the email.

After your interview you will be sent an email to confirm whether you have been offered a place.

COLCHESTER INSTITUTE

Our Colchester Campus benefits from great links by road and public transport from surrounding towns and villages. We are just a short walk from the main line at Colchester train station with regular services from Ipswich, Clacton and Chelmsford. The city centre offers a number of different bus routes across the local area.

BRAINTREE CAMPUS Church Lane, Braintree,



Essex, CM7 5SN

Located in the leafy suburb of Bocking, a short walk from Braintree town centre. There are regular local bus services that stop directly outside the campus as well as connecting buses to Braintree town centre. The train and bus stations offer regular services from Witham, Halstead, Bishop's Stortford, Great Dunmow, Chelmsford and Colchester.





Located in the heart of Colchester, this campus is the largest of our sites and is just a short walk from the railway station and historic city centre.

The College has secured over £30m during the past ten years to invest in some of the best facilities available across the country for the benefit of our students. Students are given access to high specification equipment to gain skills within a training environment that reflects modern industry. This supports learning and provides a high-quality student experience.

Our campus is always evolving with a Master Plan which focuses on upgrading and enhancing facilities each year. Several large-scale developments have been completed over the past few years to ensure you can expect great facilities to learn, work and enjoy.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

One of the more recent additions to Colchester Campus was a rooftop extension to our South Wing building which opened in 2021. This floor is dedicated to Health and Social Care students through swipe card access control and offers a range of different learning environments, including a study zone, a skills lab and dental studio. Immersive technologies provide simulated real-life environments (see page 14 for more information).

Another development includes the on-site gym that is open to all staff and students. Here you will be able to use Technogym equipment featuring a range of 'smart' equipment that rivals any local facility. The gym is free to use on a range of programmes where fitness and exercise is an integral part of the study programme, and for all others it is heavily discounted.

Recently, we have installed over 1,600 new PC computers for students and this complements our significant investment in high-speed campus-wide wifi, making sure you can stay connected at all times. You may use your own device for learning if you wish.

Over the last 12 months we have created some fantastic new facilities for our students!

Brand new professional spaces for Salon Studies

All of our facilities in this area have been fully revamped, this project includes an entirely new 42-seat hairdressing salon with spaces dedicated as show stations for guest lecturers, along with modernised beauty salons. We've also upgraded our existing classrooms and acquired the latest industry-standard equipment for our students, ensuring they are well prepared for professional employment and careers in this industry.

New Centre for Early Years

This development for Early Years features several dedicated classrooms designed to mirror those in industry, a replica nursery with a soft-play area and kitchenette along with a sensory room. Modern equipment to support teaching and learning includes new VR technology headsets and simulated babies which offer students hightech interactive learning across all course levels.

Six new workshops for Construction and the Trades

Due to demand on spaces for these areas we have opened new workshop spaces supporting housebuilding, electrical installations, wood trades, and multi-skills which includes kitchen fitting, plastering and tiling.

In Autumn 2023, we will have completed the installation of an immersive technology suite for Public Services, new CAD/CEM engineering suites and a net-zero centre incorporating training for renewable technologies.

Working in partnership with employers, including hospitals and care organisations, our fantastic new Centre for Health and Social Care Professions is providing a range of training and qualifications to meet the demand for new recruits within the health and care sectors.

Courses are designed to address local skills shortages and are delivered by highly-qualified tutors with a diverse range of professional healthcare experiences.

Located on the fourth floor of our South Wing building, the Centre for Health and Social Care Professions encompasses 2,000 square metres of innovative teaching facilities.

The centre incorporates interactive learning technology to provide skills laboratories in realistic working environments, and well-equipped classrooms to ensure students are prepared for higher education (university) or employment.

Learning resources in the centre include:

- Dedicated skills rooms for roleplay and recorded assessments
- A dental surgery and decontamination room
- An interactive facility where bespoke environments can be created to develop interpersonal and problem-solving skills around a realistic backdrop
- Rooms for collaborative learning, as well as meeting and conference rooms to support apprenticeship assessments

In 2021 the East Suffolk and North Essex NHS Foundation Trust (ESNEFT) partnered with our own Centre for Health and Social Care Professions here at Colchester Institute. ESNEFT is one of the biggest NHS Trusts in East Anglia and provides hospital and community services throughout Suffolk and North Essex.

NURTURING A FUTURE-READY WORKFORCE WITH SKILLS DEVELOPMENT ALONGSIDE QUALIFICATIONS

In the field of health and social care, skills development and qualifications are crucial for professionals to deliver high-quality care and support to individuals in need, this is why all of our students complete mandatory placements as part of their study and follow our newly developed P³ programme.

THE P³ PROGRAMME

Focusing on Preparation, Placement and Progression (P³), all students will develop the skills and professional behaviours expected to be seen in the workplace which will be delivered through a variety of workshops and online learning. This will offer students an assessed competency prior to embarking on a placement through a variety of workshops, online learning and the Care Certificate.

All Health and Social Care students must complete this mandatory training prior to starting on their placements which includes:

- · Clinical and health skills development
- Up to 72 hours of additional teaching with clinical experts throughout the year
- Roleplays and reflective exercises
- Communication and study skills

Further progression activities support students throughout the academic year ready for their next steps, such as:

- UCAS support
- Interview and employment-ready workshops
- Academic literacy development
- Resilience and wellbeing activities

Those studying under the Centre are referred to as 'Professionals in Training' and will follow the NHS 6Cs philosophy; care, courage, commitment, compassion, competence and communication. These behaviours are monitored and rewarded throughout the course.

Students will be expected to work in a variety of settings to develop different skills, and the College has placements in over 150 workplaces.

These students will be given:

- Clinical work placement at Colchester or Ipswich Hospital
- An allocated supervisor
- Compulsory NHS induction training
- An NHS mentor to support them throughout the programme
- Online training modules
- Masterclasses at the Iceni Centre, at Colchester General Hospital
- Interactive training sessions

By completing the mandatory skills training, our students will be able to access more substantial student placements which are more practical in nature and will be guaranteed a job interview on successful completion of the Career Start Programme.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BENEFIT FROM THIS OPPORTUNITY?

This programme will be open to existing students on Level 2 and Level 3 Health and Social Care programmes, Level 3 Applied Science and our Access to Higher Education Diploma in Health Professions.

There are limited spaces available on this programme, students will be selected by achievement and their commitment and dedication to their studies. These will be our shining stars who choose a vocation (pathway) within the NHS.



Students must be, at least, 17 and a half by the time they finish this programme and ready to start work, which could be full-time, part-time or even fitted around a higher education (university) course of study. For paediatric areas, students must be 18 before they start their placements.

WHAT MAKES UP A STUDY PROGRAMME?

Study Programmes are what we call our full-time courses. They combine a number of different components developed to equip you with a set of well-rounded skills for the future. This means that vour time on campus covers lots more than your chosen subject qualification alone.

Students on a full-time study programme will have around 15 hours of timetabled classes per week, over three or more days. Each course is different. meaning timetables will vary according to your chosen subject area, level of study, and your GCSE English and Maths results.

All courses include the four mandatory aspects outlined on these two pages, and we have high expectations of your attendance, behaviour and conduct in all parts of your course.

YOUR MAIN OUALIFICATION

The main qualification you will achieve during your time at Colchester Institute will form the largest part of your programme. This will be a combination of both theory and practical learning, relevant to the subject, and it is fair to say this will probably be your favourite part!

Our experienced tutors will usually have worked in your chosen industry, and indeed some still do. This means that at all stages they are able to relate your learning to how this will apply when working in that sector. At the College we have various workshops, studios and salons that mirror industry standards, meaning that you will be using up-todate equipment and developing relevant skills and experience.

Specific entry requirements for each programme are listed on the individual subject pages, starting on page 28.

ENGLISH AND MATHS



As key skills for life, you will continue to develop your English and maths with us. If, when you enrol, you haven't yet achieved a grade 4 or above in one or both of these

subjects, you will be required to attend two hours per week of timetabled GCSE classes. Attendance at these classes is mandatory and you will be working towards GCSE resits and increasing your grades.

If you have already achieved grade 4 or above, you will have English and/or maths built around your main course qualification to allow you to continue to stretch and develop these skills.

APPLICANTS WITHOUT STANDARD GCSEs

Colchester Institute is committed to providing a supportive and inclusive learning environment. We recognise that everyone has different starting points and that there are many reasons why people don't take GCSE exams. For example: you could have been home educated, have had breaks in schooling due to health reasons, you might recently have come to the UK, or you might be taking other qualifications – and that's okay. All of our courses have specific entry requirements published in this prospectus, but in some subject areas we can be flexible and consider other ways to review your skills, knowledge and experience to assess your eligibility for our programmes.

In some cases we can consider other qualifications that are deemed to be equivalent to GCSEs, such as Functional Skills and qualifications achieved outside the UK. We may vary our usual admissions process by asking applicants to take a maths and/or English assessment to identify the level you are working at. Alternatively, we may ask you to complete a subject-related assessment to give you the opportunity to demonstrate existing skills.

If you are in this situation and would like to explore course options at Colchester Institute, please get in touch with our admissions team who look forward to discussing options with you and supporting you in your next steps. Otherwise, if you have decided on the course that you would like to apply for, please submit your application and our admissions team will be in touch.







WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

An apprenticeship is a great way to gain a new qualification, get invaluable experience that employers are looking for and earn a salary. As an apprentice you are an employee, with a contract of employment and holiday entitlement. Whilst earning you are learning, with at least 20% of your time spent off-the-job developing new knowledge, skills and behaviours. We offer a range of apprenticeships in many exciting subject areas for you to develop vour skills ready for your future career.

Our apprenticeships are made up of knowledge, skills and behaviours to provide you with a wellrounded understanding of your chosen vocation. This may include a qualification and will include development of English and maths, employability and personal development. You will usually be expected to work full-time, with either paid day release to college within your working hours or given time away from the immediate pressures of your daily duties to develop new skills leading to the completion of your apprenticeship.

In some areas there are opportunities to enrol on an inclusive apprenticeship, for those unable to work full-time due to a learning difficulty, health issue or a disability.

APPRENTICESHIP STANDARDS **CAN INCLUDE:**

- An accredited qualification, which is based on completing practical tasks and knowledge in the workplace - Award, Certificate or Diploma
- Skills that will help you while at work, such as in English and maths



HOW TO APPLY

If you are interested in an apprenticeship but do not vet have a contract of employment from an employer. we strongly advise you to apply for a full-time programme as well so you have a back-up. We will process your full-time application until you inform us you have secured an employer and have an apprenticeship contract in place. To do this, find your chosen subject area on the course finder pages of our website, choose 'Apply Online' and tick the box on the application form to confirm you are interested in an apprenticeship. The apprenticeship team will contact you for more information.

If you already have an employer with an apprenticeship contract of employment (or have an offer of employment) in place then a separate apprenticeship application form is available on our website at:

Most Level 3 apprenticeships require you to already hold a Grade 9-4 in English and Maths (please enguire further and advice and guidance will be given for those without these entry requirements).





TUITION FEES

Students' college education is funded for three academic years after leaving secondary school in Year 11. This means there are no tuition fees payable for any student who is 16, 17 or 18 years old on 31st August in the calendar year in which they begin a programme of study. So, for the 2024/2025 academic year, this applies to all young people born between 1st September 2005 to 31st August 2008. If you are older than this then course tuition fees will depend on your chosen area of study and personal circumstances. Please note: There are no tuition fees attached to an apprenticeship.



FINANCIAL SUPPORT

There is a range of financial support available for families on low incomes or in receipt of certain benefits; we will support students with the costs associated with their studies, including those listed under 'Other Additional Costs', as well as:

RECURRING CARD PAYMENT (RCP) PLAN

If you are required to pay the full cost for your course we can offer a flexible, interest free monthly payment plan to break up the cost into manageable chunks. The full course tuition fee must be at least $\mathfrak{L}200$ and paid in full before you finish the course or in six months time, whichever is first.



FUNDING FOR ADULTS

As part of the 'Level 3 Free Courses for Jobs' offer, students who have not already achieved a Level 3 or above qualification, or have this qualification or above but meet the definition for unemployment and receive state benefit, or earn a low wage, may be able to study the course for *free (restrictions apply).



ADVANCED LEARNER LOAN

If you are applying for a Level 3 course or above, and are 19 or over, your course tuition fees can be covered by an Advanced Learner Loan. For more information on the loan scheme visit:

FOCUS ON PUBLIC SERVICES

Whether dealing with a dangerous public order situation in a busy high street as a police officer, tackling a house blaze as a firefighter or protecting overseas communities from terrorists as a soldier, there are many challenges facing our uniformed protective services. The national need for well-equipped and highly motivated police officers, firefighters, soldiers, sailors and Royal Air Force officers has never been higher. Only the best applicants are successfully chosen to embark upon the training for such career paths, resulting from sound individual preparation and development.

The Public Services courses at Colchester Institute aim to prepare students who are interested in joining one of the nation's uniformed protective services for careers in the industry. These careers, which include the Police, Fire and Rescue, Armed Forces, Royal Air Force, Prison Service or UK Border Force, have a diverse variety of roles and responsibilities, often in demanding and dangerous situations and, as such, require high-calibre applicants to apply for a job with them.

Our courses will equip you with all the necessary academic qualifications and practical skills to confidently apply to the service of your choice. We will help you develop your potential, encourage you to work hard, and challenge yourself to achieve your best in all you do.

We have active links with Essex Fire and Rescue, Essex Police and the Army Reserve. We strive to provide as much exposure to these services – and others – as possible. Our students have the opportunity to speak with service personnel, learn from their experiences and often use specialist equipment, such as medical kit, communication tools and navigational equipment, to name a few.

Recently, we have invested in an immersive experience suite for our Public Services and Sport students, featuring a simulator booth with motion sensors, surround sound and a wrap-around projection system, allowing students to undertake stimulating teaching and learning sessions based upon real-life scenarios. This brings an added layer of realism to many of our assessments and roleplay activities by allowing students to interact with their simulated surroundings, bringing value to the overall learning experience.



We visit community service locations and regularly invite uniformed protective services members to the College for talks and workshops. In 2023, for example, we welcomed teams from The Parachute Regiment, Royal Marines, Essex Police, and Essex Fire and Rescue.

Upon successfully completing your study programme, you will be prepared to apply for a career in any of the uniformed protective services or a higher education university place, studying Criminology or other associated degree-level courses.



FUNDING FOR ADULTS

All of the courses in this guide are open to adults (anyone aged 19 or over), provided the eligibility criteria is met. Our courses (known as Study Programmes) are designed to help you get the qualifications you want, to provide you with the opportunity to build a rewarding career or expand your knowledge and skills in your chosen subject.

WILL I HAVE TO PAY A FEE?

Maybe not! Fee exemptions are available for some Study Programmes and for some students. Funding depends on a number of things, such as your age, the programme that you want to study, the qualifications that you already have and, in some cases, your benefit entitlements. We have staff who can talk to you about your options and signpost you to further information. Any 19+ adult with earnings of less than £20,319 per annum (regardless of hours) could study a co-funded course for free.

Advanced Learner Loan

If you are aged 19 or over and planning to study a Study Programme at Levels 3 to 6, then you are likely to qualify for an Advanced Learner Loan or Higher Education Loan to help you pay for tuition fees. These loans are from the UK government. They are easy to apply for, your household income is not taken into account and there is no credit check. LEVEL 3 FREE COURSES FOR JOBS

The National Skills Fund gives adult learners (who will be studying for their first full Level 3 qualification) the opportunity to study a course for free.
